# District Director's Report - August 2010 Rich DeMartino

### **New Orleans NABC**

The Summer NABC was held at the New Orleans Marriott. Attendance was 10,956 tables, about 12% lower than pre-tournament expectations, which makes this NABC the smallest Summer NABC since the Miami NABC in 1995.

For most NABCs, the reaction of the players is usually fairly consistent. In New Orleans, many players were pleased with the accessibility to numerous fine restaurants and tourist sites. There were also a few negative views of the site either because of the intense heat, which was certainly not a surprise, or problems with the playing areas (e.g., some thought the playing areas were too cold and/or bathrooms were not easily accessible from some of the playing rooms). All I spoke to thought the local volunteers did a great job.

## **CEO Report**

CEO Jay Baum reported that for the first six months of 2010 membership increased by 250 members. The June 2010 membership is 4,957 greater than June 2009.

Jay also reported that tournaments are continuing to do well with regionals showing an increase of nearly 3000 tables compared with 2009. In addition, the STAC table average of 1,676 is a strong indication that these tournaments continue to be very popular.

#### **Financial Results**

Management reported that for the first five months of 2010, the ACBL is about \$175,000 worse off than expected when compared with the five-month budget estimate. A further concern is that the lower-than-expected table count in New Orleans will result in an additional shortfall of approximately \$70,000. For 2010, we budgeted a loss of \$375,000 so unless Management is able to implement corrective actions to improve results, the 2010 projected loss could rise to in excess of \$600,000. Management and the Finance Committee are developing appropriate steps to address the shortfall.

## **Senior Mixed Pairs**

A motion was made that a Senior Mixed Pairs be added to the Fall NABC schedule beginning in 2011. The event will be held on Wednesday and Thursday and will consist of two qualifying and two final sessions. The motion passed 23-2.

#### **Conditions of Contest**

The following motion was passed unanimously: "Unless instructed otherwise by a tournament director, a member of each side must be present and seated before cards are removed from a board."

#### National Goodwill Committee

In honor of her many years of dedicated service to the ACBL, the Board voted unanimously to change the name of the ACBL Goodwill Committee to the Eileen Osofsky ACBL Goodwill Committee. Eileen passed away on June 22 after serving 25 years as Chairman of this committee.
