## SLOW PLAY REMINDER

If you are a habitually (or even occasionally) slow player, you should be aware that there are new rules governing your conduct at the bridge table. These new, stricter rules will be applied at this and future tournaments.

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous to your opponents -- and to all other competitors as well. Players and pairs who take more than their allotted time will be subject to penalty. And if you do fall behind, even if through no fault of your own, you nevertheless have a clear obligation to get caught up as soon as possible. If you do not, then you may well be subject to a slow play penalty.

## La Femme Fatale

Things were admittedly going badly for Alfredo Versace of Italy and Chantal Haemmerli of Switzerland, who were suffering a below par game (having averaged well over $60 \%$ previously) in Monday morning's second final session of the National Mixed Pairs. But as if that weren't enough, when they came to Linda and Brian Trent's table, things got even worse. What happened to the Italian triple world title holder on the second board of the round would be described as cruel were it not so brilliant.

The source of Versace's angst on this day was his RHO, Linda Trent. Linda, normally a quiet, unassuming intermediate player and teacher of newcomers. She undergoes a radical personality transformation when she dons her dark glasses and suits up to play against the big guns of the bridge world. Just watch Linda in action ... and Alfredo in misery.

Two clubs was strong and artificial, $2 \star$ negative, and $3 \vee$ transferred to spades after Versace's natural 2NT rebid. Versace thought long and hard before finally passing 4a, so perhaps a different auction would have denied interest beyond game. Anyhow, North led the $\$ 10$ and when dummy came down Versace smiled broadly, thanked his partner, and set about making his game.

After winning the $\varangle K(!)$ at trick one, Versace ruffed the $\$ 4$ to dummy in order to play a trump toward his hand, hoping to find queen and one onside, inserting the 9 as South followed low. North won the A led a third diamond as Versace pitched a club from dummy and South ruffed $\ldots$ with the a Q ! She then shifted to a low club.

Versace won his ace and paused to consider how to continue. Assuming the Q to be a true card (could this unassuming woman in the dark glasses really have ruffed unnecessarily high? Impossible.), North held both outstanding trumps. If Versace drew trumps ending in hand, he could pitch dummy's last two clubs on his two remaining high diamonds, and then knock out the $\boldsymbol{A}$.

But then the defense could win the first heart, tap dummy with a club, and with the heart suit blocked he would have to win the next heart in hand and lose a club in the ending.

Versace thought he found a solution: he would first cash his high diamonds, pitching dummy's losing clubs as North followed helplessly and South pitched (having no more trumps!?). Then he could knock out the $\boldsymbol{\vee}$, win any return, unblock the hearts, and draw trumps ending in dummy to enjoy his $\varphi \mathrm{J}$.

So, having carefully formulated his plan, Versace cashed a high diamond, pitching a club from dummy as North followed and Linda . . . ruffed with the $\uparrow 8$ ! She then led a club to her husband's king to beat declarer two tricks in a cold contract. (If North had earlier unblocked his $\boldsymbol{K}$ under the ace South could have cashed the Q and given North a club ruff to beat the contract three tricks!)

It's true - the female of the species is deadlier than the male.
Move over, Nikita; make room for La Femme Linda.

# Planning Ahead

You are in the midst of a bidding sequence such as

| partner | you |  |  |

| $2 \downarrow$ | Pass |  |  |

What should your partner have for his $2 \vee$ bid?
A minimum opening, usually with four hearts.
What if the bidding went (opponents passing):
1*-1v-[a long hesitation and then] $2 \boldsymbol{v}$.
What does partner have now?

1. Three hearts?
2. A bad 16 points, or a super 15 points, with four hearts?
3. Four very bad hearts and four very good spades?

What partner does not have is four hearts and 13 points.
You are on defense and you lead the Ace from your $\uparrow$ AKxxx which you had opened the bidding with. There are three small spades in the dummy. Partner smoothly plays the $\AA 9$. You continue with the $\AA K$, partner plays the 2 , and you give partner a ruff.
What would all this mean if you had led the $\uparrow A$ and partner thought for a while before playing the $\$ 9$ ? Is partner still showing a high-low? Does partner want you to shift to the higher outstanding suit?
Is partner just telling you they like your lead?
What partner probably doesn't have is a simple high-low of the 9 and the 2 .
How do we as bridge players avoid these two above stated examples of unwarranted hesitations, and many others that might occur? The answer is simple - we should be prepared for what we are going to bid or play ahead of time. When we are dealt:

We should plan ahead for what our rebids will be when partner makes a normal or expected response. If the auction starts $1 *-(\mathrm{P})-1-(\mathrm{P})$, we should not need to "go into the tank" after partners $1 \vee$ response; rather, we should plan ahead as to what our rebid will be beforehand. Holding the $\uparrow 92$, we should know beforehand what we will play when partner leads the A (from AK).

On defense, declarer leads toward a side suit of KJxxx in the dummy, and we hold the ace in front of the above named suit. If declarer's lead was at trick 2 , we may have a legitimate problem as to whether to play the ace or not. However, if declarer's lead was at trick 7 or 8 , shouldn't we have thought ahead as to what we are going to do? And now, we can do it smoothly, and give declarer a real guess.

Good bidding and good defense often go hand-in-hand with good ethics. Think ahead about what you will do after any expected "normal" response to your bid or play before you make it. Nobody expects a smooth bid after wild, unexpected auctions like $1 *-(1 *)-1 \vee-(5 \diamond)-? ? ?$, but after an auction like $1 *-(\mathrm{P})-1 \downarrow-(\mathrm{P})-$ ???, we really should be prepared to make our bid in an even tempo.
