# The New England Knockout Team Regional Tournament

in Cromwell, CT

Welcome to the New England Knockout Team Regional!!! The tournament begins today, and will conclude on Monday, February 20. This tournament has been held every year since 1930, making it the oldest continuously running regional bridge tournament in the country!

We offer a full calendar of events for players at every skill level. The premiere event in the tournament, the 64<sup>th</sup> running of the Alfred H. Morehead Knockout Teams, starts Friday night. The winner receives the coveted Morehead Trophy. This tournament also features our new, simplified, District 25 tournament schedule, with most events at 10:00 and 2:30. We offer a 2-session team event and a pair event every day, Wednesday through Saturday, as well as side games in the evenings.

For our newcomers and intermediate players, we offer a full schedule of events, from today through Sunday. In addition, we feature *four* "Gold Rush" events: a Gold Rush Knockout on Wednesday, a Gold Rush Swiss Team game on Thursday, and a Gold Rush Pairs on Friday, and another Gold Rush Knockout on Saturday.

## New use of the clock in Swiss Team events

We have started using the clock slightly differently in Swiss Team and Bracketed Round Robin Team events. Rather than showing the time when you must start your final board, the clock represents the time when the result must be turned in at the scoring table. Obviously, since this includes the time needed to complete all boards, score the match, confirm the result with your opponents, and submit the score, more time will be put on the clock for each match. However, if the ticket is turned in late (even one second late!), then *BOTH* teams may be subject to a slow play penalty. A warning may be given the first time (though excessive lateness could warrant a penalty even then), but a second infraction WILL result in an automatic penalty.

What can you do? Be efficient. Keep an eye on the clock. Save post-mortems until after the match is scored. If your opponents are excessively slow, let a director know. If you find yourself in time trouble, consider skipping the last board of the match. If you start a board with less than ten minutes on the clock, you do so at your own risk - you may well have difficulty completing the hand, comparing, and getting your result in on time.

Bridge is a timed event. All participants are expected to keep within the time allotted. Slow play delays the entire event, and is discourteous, not only to your opponents, but to every player in the room. Please help keep our events running quickly and smoothly.

## HUNGRY?

Welcome to the New England Knockout Regional! To make your experience more pleasurable, we have prepared an extensive restaurant guide for establishments in Cromwell and neighboring towns. The guide includes 89 restaurants; menus for 75 may be found in the menu binders at the hospitality table. They are organized by town and, within each town, by street. A master list of restaurants is at the hospitality table, and inside each of the menu books. The list includes addresses and phone numbers. Additionally, the restaurants have been classified by cuisine. Multiple copies of this list by cuisine are available for your use and reference. Numbers after the names (C-5, R-2, W-7, etc.) show the town they are located in (Cromwell, Rocky Hill, Wethersfield, etc.), and their number on the master list and in the menu book. Brief directions are included in the master list, and a large map, with reference numbers, is located at the hospitality table. We plan to have the hospitality table staffed AFTER the morning session and briefly AFTER the afternoon session, to answer questions and provide any assistance or advice you need. Check out the menu for restaurants you're interested in, and don't forget to make reservations, especially for large groups or on the weekend (and for Valentine's Day!).
