Attendance was 11,429, a bit below the pre-tournament estimate of 12.000 tables.

Highlights of ACBL Board Meeting

CEO Report

CEO Robert Hartman reported that membership for 2011 remained fairly stable. Through October, 9,900 new members joined the ACBL resulting in a modest net increase of about 300 members and bringing total membership to 165,300 members.

Average table count year-to-date for Regionals is 1477 and for Sectionals 170. These numbers are almost identical to 2010. STAC attendance through October is up about 4300 tables nationwide, an increase of 6% over 2010.

The new edition of the Encyclopedia of Bridge is now available.

2012 ACBL President

Sharon Anderson from District 14 was elected 2012 ACBL P resident.

Financial Results

The current forecast of 2011 results based on actual results through September is for a gain of \$399,000. This result is \$282,000 more favorable than the budgeted gain of \$117,000. For 2012, the Finance Committee and BOD are budgeting a modest loss of \$118,000. Two one-time expenses explain much of this deficit: \$30,000 for added expenses for the 75th Anniversary of the ACBL in 2012 and \$55,000 as a result of paying the salary of the new CEO in addition to amounts still due Jay Baum in 2012.

There are two proposed fee increases for 2012: a 4% increase in TD session fees and \$.04 increase in tournament per table sanction fees, both effective April 1. Club sanction fees and NABC entry fees are unchanged for 2012.

Overall, the ACBL continues to be in outstanding financial condition.

Changes in Masterpoint Awards

There are some minor changes to masterpoint awards for NABC events, which are documented in the BOD minutes on the ACBL website. The first overall award for the new Senior Mixed Pairs is 80 masterpoints. For club and online games of 12-17 boards, the awards are being reduced from 80% of the full award to 60%.

After a lengthy discussion in committee and on the floor of the board, a decision to implement a strength-of-field component for pairs and non-KO team games was deferred until the 2012 meeting in Memphis.

Online Masterpoints for Rank Advancement

For rank advancement requirements there are presently certain restrictions for the number of online points that count toward advancement (e.g., no more than one third of the points required may come from online play). These restrictions are being removed from the requirements as of January 1, 2012. For further details, please refer to the BOD minutes.

Grand Life Master Qualifications

Any player who has been expelled or suspended for a total 120 days or more for Ethics Violations will be considered ineligible to attain the rank of Grand Life Master.

NABC Site Selection
