District Director's Report – July 2012

Philadelphia NABC

The Summer NABC was held at the Marriott in Philadelphia. Attendance was 11,913 tables, a bit below the pretournament estimate of 12,500 tables. The attendance is somewhat disappointing for a Summer NABC. The average Summer NABC table count for the past 5 years excluding Las Vegas in 2008 (19,720 tables), is 13,050 tables.

This tournament was more controversial than most of our NABCs, primarily due to the starting times. All NABC events started at 10 and 3 or in some cases 10 and 4. Regional events generally started at 10 and 2:30 though there were also events at 1 and 7:30. The most meaningful observation I can make is that almost no one is neutral on this subject; players generally either love or hate the earlier starting times.

I was asked why the Board approved these starting times for Philadelphia. Simply stated, the only NABC that previously had early starting times was Atlanta in 2005. It was agreed that if a District wanted to try earlier starting times again, they would make a request to the Board. Philadelphia did just that a couple of years ago and received approval based on their assertion that the earlier starting times would result in many more local players being able to play.

The ACBL is planning to do a survey on starting times at NABCs. If this does not take place soon, I plan to do a survey of our players with help from Bob Bertoni. In any event, I will solicit the opinions of the Delegates in November. Please feel free to continue giving me your feedback before then if you wish to do so.

Special congratulations to Donald Caplan and Zack Grossack who won the 0 - 5000 LM Pairs and also to our GNT Flight C team who made it all the way to the finals.

Financial Results

The Finance Committee reported the following results for the first five months of 2012:

CEO Report

CEO Robert Hartman reported that overall membership has grown by 1,219 members for the first six months of 2012. Current membership is 166,637. He also reported that average table count at tournaments has decreased slightly over the first six months of 2012 compared with 2011. Management is now sending out Happy Birthday e-mails to our members and these have been well received, with many of the players sending "Thank You" notes back to Management.

The CEO announced the hiring of two new employees. Bruce Knoll has been hired as the new Director of Information Technology. This position was recommended over a year ago by the BOD Technology Committee, which I chaired, so we are all pleased that this key position has been filled. Bryan Delfs has been hired as the new Education Manager and seems well-suited to do this important job. He is both young and enthusiastic.

The CEO also reported that work on the new ACBL Score+ project is on-time and within budget.

NABC and NABC+ Matchpoint Events

A motion was passed that permits the Director-In-Charge to combine as many sections as logical and practical for scoring (in the finals of these events all scoring is done across the field).

Further, and more importantly, qualification for subsequent stages shall be based on the overall standing in the entire field, regardless of section and/or direction. What this means is that in determining who qualifies, those with the highest percentages will advance. This change eliminates the long-standing problem of a pair with a higher percentage in one combined section not qualifying while a pair in another combined section may qualify with a lower percentage.

Strength of Field - Masterpoints

I am disappointed to report that in a close and contentious vote the changes proposed to eliminate some of the existing masterpoint inconsistencies in our pair and Swiss team games was defeated 13-11-1. Frank Hacker from Vermont was one of three mathematicians who helped produce formulas which would have introduced a strength-of- field component into our pair and Swiss games rather than basing the award solely on the size of other games being held that day, as we do presently.

The proposed formulas would not have resulted in any significant changes either in overall masterpoints awarded or for any particular group. Presently, the main problem is that Stratiflighted Pair and Swiss Team games can have significantly different awards depending on whether there is a gold rush or large Senior game on a particular day. As an example, at our recent Sturbridge Regional, there were two Swiss Team games, one with a gold rush and the other on a day where there was not a gold rush game. The Tuesday game with 18 tables plus a gold rush event awarded 26 masterpoints while the Thursday game with 44 tables awarded only 19 masterpoints. Under the proposed formula, this problem would be eliminated.

Strategic Plan

The BOD spent a full day working on a 5 Year Strategic Plan. Our mission, vision and the five strategic focus areas are documented in the official minutes. If any of you has input on the either the process or the focus areas, I would appreciate your input.

As usual, the complete minutes of the BOD meeting will be published on the ACBL website within the next two weeks. Please let me know if you have questions or other feedback on actions taken by the BOD.
