District Director's Report – March 2012

Memphis NABC

The Spring NABC was held at the Cook Convention Center in Memphis, Tennessee. Attendance was 9,626 tables, fairly close to pre-tournament expectations. The Convention Center has superb playing space and excellent lighting, with the playing space being very close to the host hotel and several other hotels.

Tournament Co-Chairs, Henry Francis, a former New Englander and long-term ACBL Bulletin Editor, and Don Paterson, and their committee did an outstanding job making this tournament special. I extend our appreciation to the entire Committee and a very special thanks to Prize Committee Chair Ed Davis, who was at the Registration Desk about 10 hours a day, always with a big smile, handling prizes, registration, tours and restaurants. Evening hospitality was excellent and the daily treats during the sessions were also well received. The only complaint I heard is that many thought the daily room rate of \$165 including tax was quite high for a city like Memphis.

Everyone who attended had a good time and, as you will note below, there were three winners from our District. Special kudos to Sheila Gabay, who becomes the 15th Grand Life Master in our District with her win in the Mixed Pairs.

Highlights of ACBL Board Meeting

CEO Report

CEO Robert Hartman reported that membership numbers have gotten off to a very good start in 2012. As of the end of February, total membership stands at 166,145, the highest figure since the mid-1990s. At the same point last year, membership was 164,499. There have been 2,329 new members year-to-date, a 13% increase over 2011.

Tournaments are also doing well. Through February, average Regional table count is up 8%; average STAC table count is up 3%; and, average Sectional table count is down 5%. Club table count (including on-line games) for January is 290,126, an increase of 6.5% over 2011.

The CEO also reported the very good trend in NAP club qualifying games:

Financial Results

The final result for calendar year 2011 is a net gain of \$516,000, which compares very favorably with the 2011 approved budget of \$117,000. This result is despite the fact that the Seattle Fall NABC profit was almost \$180,000 worse than projected. For 2012, the BOD approved a budget which projects a gain of \$86,000.

Junior Fund Money

The Junior Task Force initially submitted a motion which would have eliminated Junior Coupons for players who have more than 500 masterpoints. Fortunately, as a result of some negative feedback, this motion was modified in Committee to eliminate the masterpoint restrictions. The motion which passed is as follows:

Junior coupons will be made available for junior members in good standing for entry into events at NABCs.

- A. Any junior under the age of 26 years who is a full time student (must provide proof of eligibility) will be entitled to coupons that can be used for any event. These coupons will have a value of \$10.00 per session.
- B. Any junior under the age of 21 years will be entitled to coupons that can be used for any event. These coupons will have a value of \$10.00 per session.
- C. Any junior under the age of 19 years will be granted free plays for each session of regionally rated events.

I wish to thank those juniors in our district and other districts who wrote to me expressing their views on this subject. I was opposed to the initial motion before seeing the letters but it is gratifying to learn how important junior coupons are to our younger players.

New Masterpoint Formula

I regret to report that once again the BOD has deferred making a decision on a proposed revised method of computing masterpoints for pair and non-KO team games. Frank Hacker from our District is one of two mathematicians who did a great job developing the proposed new formulas. The changes proposed are relatively minor and fix some known problems. Without going into too much detail, the two basic problems are:

- (i) When stratified games were introduced many years ago, a decision was made to credit the top flight with all the tables from lower flights. What has happened over the years is that tables are sometimes credited to an event starting at a different time or even from a completely different event (e.g., a pair game receives credit for tables in a Senior Swiss event).
- (ii) when an A/X game is held on a day where there is a Gold Rush game, the awards are quite a bit higher even though the field is essentially the same as on another day when there is no Gold Rush game but a smaller B/C game instead. The proposed changes would make the awards for the A/X game the about the same both days, if the size and strength of the event are about the same, clearly a more desirable result.

Neither of these results was intended many years ago when stratified games were introduced. I'll be happy to discuss this subject further with anyone who may be interested but be assured the proposed formulas, if adopted, will not cause any group of players a problem.
