District Director's Report – March 2014

Dallas NABC

The Spring NABC was held at the Sheraton Downtown in Dallas, Texas. Attendance was 9,891 tables, a bit below the pre-tournament estimate of 10,000 tables. The playing space was generally adequate though on many days there were serious problems with temperature control. I regret to report that I received far more complaints about this NABC than usual. The main problem is that there were very few places to eat near the hotel. There was a food court just a short distance from the hotel but most places in the food court were closed in the evening and also on weekends. Others observed that the breakfast buffet at the Sheraton was both overpriced (\$22) and highly unsatisfactory. Finally, most believe the prices at the concession stands were unacceptably high (e.g., \$3 for a coffee, soda or a cookie and \$5 for a small ice cream bar).

Table count in the new 0 - 10,000 KO held concurrent with the Vanderbilt was only 20 tables, which is quite disappointing. One problem is that pre-registration closed at 8:00 pm Sunday night so those playing in the Silver Ribbon Pairs that day were not able to enter the KO event since they did not know whether or not they were going to qualify for the finals the following day. We can fix this problem by moving the pre-registration deadline to the morning the KO starts, which should have been done in Dallas. I welcome any additional comments you may have regarding the new KO or the Dallas NABC in general.

Congratulations to our NABC winner, Bernie Yomtov, who won the Silver Ribbon Pairs, his first NABC title.

Highlights of ACBL Board Meeting

CEO Report

CEO Robert Hartman reported that membership at the end of February is 167,763, about 880 more than in February 2013.

Through February, Regional table count has decreased by 8% but average Regional table count is up 13% (there were 4 fewer Regionals on the schedule during the first two months of 2014). Total Sectional table count is down 9% while average Sectional table count is down 6%. STAC Table count has declined by 5%. Total 2013 table count for clubs is 3,128,529, of which 942,040 tables are from online games.

The CEO announced that there will be a preview of the newly designed ACBL website over the next few weeks. I encourage you to forward comments on the new website so I can pass them along to Management. I expressed concern in the meeting that the Board was not asked for input on the new design prior to the planned release.

Financial Results

Final results for the 2013 calendar year are as follows:

2013 Budget: \$ 32,300 2013 Actual: \$ 200,700 Variance: + \$168,400

2014 Budget: + \$5,800

Management has suggested that we consider a change in the way we charge for tournaments. Presently, there is a sanction fee based on tables plus separate charges for Tournament Directors (including lodging, per diem and travel). We will consider whether it is preferable to have one combined charge based on table count. The Finance Committee supported the proposal to move forward on such a plan. I will seek District and Unit input as soon more details become available. My initial reaction is there are both pros and cons to the proposal.

Responsibilities of Tournament Sponsors and DICs

I chaired a committee which produced a document titled: "Roles and Responsibilities of Tournament Sponsors and DICs." This document, approved by the Board, defines the official rules for determining which responsibilities rest with the Sponsoring Organization, which are at the option of Director In Charge and which are shared. Basically, the District or Unit has the final decision on matters such as # of boards to be played in pair games (24-27); # of boards to be played in Swiss team games (48-56); whether or not to use masterpoint averaging; and whether to use handicapping in KOs. Details are included in the final minutes. This committee was formed primarily because some TDs in other parts of the country were under the mistaken impression that the final decision maker on these issues is the DIC.

Proposed Changes to NABC Schedule

Based on committee recommendations, the Board voted to implement several changes to the NABC Schedule, including: (i) Move the Fast Pairs, currently played in the Summer, to the Spring NABC opposite the Swiss on the last weekend; (ii) Extend the four-session Swiss on the last weekend of the Summer NABC to six sessions; and (iii) Move both the Mixed BAM, currently played on Thursday/Friday in the Summer and the Werner Open Pairs, currently played on Tuesday/Wednesday in the Summer to Wednesday/Thursday (the two events will be run concurrently as is currently the case with the Mixed BAM and Fast Pairs). Finally, change the six-session Swiss on the last weekend of the Fall NABC to four sessions.

I support all the changes except for shortening the six-session Swiss to four sessions, which I strongly oppose. My reasons are simple: most of the 194 teams who played in last year's North American Swiss will have no NABC event to play in on Friday except the Reisinger, an extremely tough event which most will not enter. Additionally, many of those who regularly play in the Reisinger have indicated they strongly prefer coming down to 10 - 15 teams on the final day; even if only 20 additional teams enter the Reisinger, that is no longer possible without severe cuts.

ACBL Score+

The CEO reported that work on ACBL Score+ has fallen about nine months behind schedule. Since ACBL Score+ is so critical to our future, this report is of great concern to many board members. Few reasons were given for the delays but we are assured Management will make take whatever actions are necessary to complete the project satisfactorily.
