District Director's Report – July 2014

Las Vegas NABC

The Summer NABC was held at the Westgate Las Vegas Hotel. Attendance was 16,617 tables, a very respectable table count but lower than the pre-tournament estimate of 18,000 tables and considerably below the peak Las Vegas table count of 24,221 in 1991.

Several players voiced concerns about the host hotel for a variety of reasons. Many believe the hotel is a bit run down and others observed the charges for some of the amenities were unreasonably high, such as a \$14 per day for using the Internet. There was no free Wi-Fi in the hotel.

The most significant news is the outstanding performance of six of our players who won open NABC Championships, including the two major events. Hearty congratulations to: Doug Doub and Frank Merblum who won the Life Master Pairs; Adam and Zachary Grossack who won the Fast Pairs by a wide margin; Allan Graves who won the Spingold; and Paul Fireman who won the Open Swiss on the final weekend. A superlative performance by these players.

Highlights of ACBL Board Meeting

CEO Report

CEO Robert Hartman reported that overall membership has increased only slightly for the first six months of the year. Average Regional table count is down 9% (1,422 vs. 1,571) and average Sectional table count is down 7% (165 vs. 178). STACs are a bright spot with total and average table count up 2%.

Though not as bad as District 25's decline in Regional table count, these figures should be a concern for all.

Financial Results

The Finance Committee reported the following results based on actuals through May 31:

The main reasons presented for the negative variance are: worse than expected Regionals at Sea income (\$73,000 lower); higher than anticipated insurance payments on two claims (\$46,000); and additional expenditures for Technology (TourneyTrax support, Learn to Play Bridge site hosting and Results Reporting infrastructure development).

North American Swiss - Fall Schedule

In Dallas, the ACBL Board passed a motion to reduce the Fall Swiss from 3 days to two starting on Saturday instead of Friday, to be effective in 2015. As a result of a request from the Board of Governors to reconsider the motion as well as input from the C&C Committee based on a poll of the players who played in that event last year, the Board voted to restore the Fall Swiss to 3 days starting on Friday. I am delighted we corrected this problem. The C&C Committee is considering other changes to the Fall schedule; if these changes have merit, they will be presented in the near future.

ACBL Score

I reported in my last report that our CEO advised us that work on ACBL Score+ had fallen about nine months behind schedule and that a complete review would be done as quickly as possible. Robert advised us that as a result of the review Management decided to halt work on the proposed new ACBL Score+ project and instead make enhancements to the existing ACBL Score. I can only report this is a major disappointment to me and several other board members. The CEO promised that more details and specific project goals would be presented to the Board no later than the Fall NABC.

Masterpoint Changes

Some significant changes are being proposed in Masterpoints. These will not be final until a second reading in November. I will attempt to describe the highlights as briefly as I can but suggest that those interested in more detail read the complete board minutes. I am more than happy to answer any questions you may have before Providence.

<u>NABC Events:</u> Masterpoint awards for several NABC events are being changed, including: the NAP A award will increase from 65 to 100 masterpoints; the GNT NABC level awards are all being raised; and, the match awards for the Spingold and Vanderbilt are being increased from 6 masterpoints to 10 masterpoints (8 for the Senior KO and Wagar).

<u>Pair games</u>: Awards for all Regional, Sectional, STAC and other non-NABC pair games are being increased by 25%. Historically, all awards have been based on number of tables, not number of participants. Many believe winning a 30 table Swiss is equivalent to winning a 30 table pair game but others correctly observe there are double the participants in a pair game. After much analysis and discussion, we decided that increasing the award for pair games by 25% is a reasonable compromise.

X Strata Awards: Presently, there is a serious problem in the way X awards are computed. What causes this problem is that under present rules the X award must be 105% of the first place award for the top strata in the game below. Consequently, a very small stratum will receive a higher award than perhaps a far larger game below. Those in the X category have a chance at winning the A overall awards which is a big benefit but now the award will be computed based on a factor times the full A award and is no longer guaranteed to be higher than the top award for the lower flight.

<u>Increased Strata:</u> One of the major objectives of the current Masterpooint Committee was to address the perception that the popularity of gold rush games has disenfranchised those with just above 750 masterpoints. These players often must compete and play against players with far more masterpoints.

The Masterpoint Committee is proposing two new types of games to solve this problem, one on a permanent basis (3-3) and the other on a trial basis (2-2-2). First, a stratum is being added to the top flight, so all games will be allowed to add a separate stratum for 750 - 1500 (or possibly higher). We are also planning to allow a District to hold a game with 3 separate flights (e.g. Gold Rush; 750 -

2500; and 2500+), each with 2 strata. This will initially be on a trial basis and requires advance approval. I plan to provide more details in a separate release but I am hopeful those players currently most affected will welcome and be enthusiastic about these proposals.
